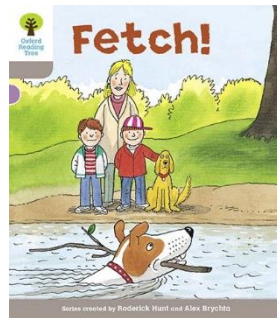




Reception Reading Book Instructions



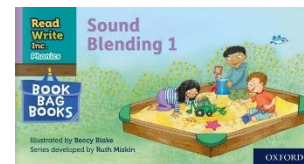
Wordless Books



When your child first starts Reception they will begin to receive wordless picture books. These books are really important in your child's reading development. Children will develop their confidence in reading and create their own story. This is also a great way to support their reading comprehension as there are many discussion points and questions which can be found in the book.

On the first page in the book there are suggested talking points as well as during reading and after reading there are also more suggested talking points. This book should be shared throughout the week to support their reading confidence.

Sound Blending Books & Speed Sounds Book



Once your child has started learning Set 1 Sounds they will get a Speed Sounds Book. Each sound has a picture and phrase to help your child remember the sound as well as the actual sound e.g. 'a'. They will also get Sound Blending books, these will have words with the sounds known to them such as 'top, duck, sat'.

Ditties

When your child can read all of the Set 1 Sounds and start to blend they will begin to take these sheets home. These sheets will have sounds to practice across the top, green words which your child can fred talk (sound out) then blend and red words that your child may need support with reading. Your child will then read the sentences.

Speed Sounds - read the sounds (not the letter name)

a g t p n s d o i

Green Words - read these words by blending the sounds together

not got sip pop dad did dog

Red Words - read these words but tell your child the word if they get stuck

I got pop

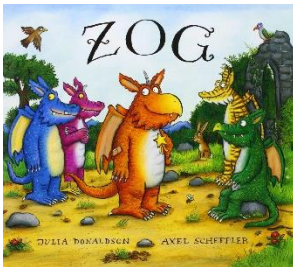
dad got a sip

the dog did not

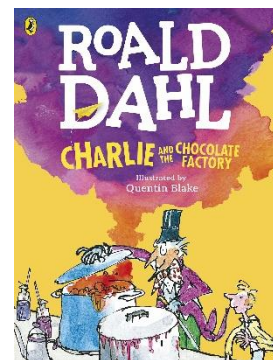


Reading for Pleasure Book 3
